TB Control/Refugee Health Program

1. What is a health screening?

A health history and physical examination.

A check of your immunizations.

Tests you get:

TB
Hepatitis B
Sexually transmitted diseases
Heart disease
Diabetes
Anemia
Parasites
HIV

2. Why do I need a health screening?

You need a health screening as part of your resettlement process.

To get immunizations you must have in the United States.

To get your green card you must have all your shots.

3. What will happen during the examination?

The doctor will look at you to check your health.

4. How do I make my appointment?

Your case manager will call your doctor, take you to the appointment and interpret.

5. What do I need to bring with me?

Overseas medical report.

Chest x-rays.

Immunization records (if any).

Medicine you are currently taking (if any).

6. What's next?

Your case manager will help you get into a health plan (insurance) and choose a primary care provider.

If your TB test is positive you get a Chest X-Ray.
