Purpose

The purpose of HARP is to obtain previously owned hearing aids from local communities, service the hearing aids, and make them available to eligible hearing-impaired children throughout Utah.

ELIGIBILITY

TO QUALIFY FOR HARP, A CHILD MUST:

- Be a resident of Utah
- Be diagnosed by an audiologist with pediatric expertise as having hearing loss and in need of hearing aids
- Be between the ages of six and eighteen years old (children younger than six should apply for the CHAP program– health.utah.gov/chap)
- Be ineligible to receive a hearing aid through Utah’s Medicaid program
- Not have insurance coverage for hearing aids
- Meet the financial need qualification criteria established by the Utah Department of Health for participation in the program (currently up to 225% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines)

HOW DO I APPLY?

Participating pediatric audiologists can obtain the appropriate application materials to begin the application process and can assist you in determining your child’s eligibility to participate in HARP. Application materials are also available on our website:

HOW DO I SUBMIT MY CHILD’S APPLICATION?

Application forms can be submitted via mail, fax, or e-mail at the contact information located on the back of this pamphlet. Additional materials needed include:

- ◆ Recent audiogram
- ◆ Medical clearance (if this is the first time hearing aid(s) will be worn)
- ◆ Insurance denial
