


Influenza-Like Illness (ILI) Activity in Utah

 Influenza-like illness (ILI) in Utah has been above the epidemic level for 0 weeks.



 MMWR Week 16: 4/19/2009 to 4/25/2009




High (Elevated) = ILI rate is above the state epidemic level.

Influenza-Associated Hospitalizations

So far this influenza season, there have been 225 influenza-associated hospitalizations reported to the Utah Department of Health. At this time last year, there had been 500 influenza-associated hospitalizations reported to the Utah Department of Health. The majority of individuals hospitalized with influenza have risk factors for severe illness, which is expected. 79% of influenza-associated hospitalizations have been identified as Type A, 15% Type B, and 6% unknown.


