Problems In Emergency Response

Common To All

- Communications
- Who's in charge
- Nonstandard terminology
- Inability to expand and contract as needed
- Span of Control
- Information Sharing

What is ICS designed to do?

- Meet the needs of incidents of any kind or size.
- Allow personnel from a variety of agencies and organizations to meld rapidly into a common management structure.
- Provide logistical and administrative support to operational staff.
- Be cost effective by avoiding duplication of efforts.





IAP - Incident Action Plan

- Every incident must have an Incident Action Plan (IAP) that:
 - Specifies the incident objectives.
 - States the activities to be completed.
 - Identifies resources and assignments.
 - Covers a specified timeframe, called an operational period.
 - May be oral or written—except for hazardous materials incidents, which require a written IAP.





Pre-incident (Mosquito Season)

- Know the beast
- Get the right people to participate in exercises and drills
- Keep your ear to the rail
- Use ICS for event planning

Suspected or Confirmed Incident

- Establish ICS
- Name the Event
- IAP
- Sit Rep

Incident Response

- Adjust Planning Period
- Add De-mob as an objective

Unity of Command

- Each person involved will be assigned to only **one** supervisor.

Chain of Command

- means that there is an orderly line of authority within the ranks of the organization

Communications

- Common Terminology
- Clear Text
- Formal communication goes through the chain of command


ICS Vs. Administrative Structure

- No correlation with any agency – this is to help avoid confusion over different positions, titles and org charts



Span of Control

- Effective = 1 supervisor – three to seven but 1 to 5 BEST



Management by Objectives: Steps



- The steps for establishing incident objectives include:
 - **Step 1:** Understand organization policy and direction.
 - **Step 2:** Assess incident situation.
 - **Step 3:** Establish incident objectives.
 - **Step 4:** Select appropriate strategy or strategies to achieve objectives.
 - **Step 5:** Perform tactical direction.
 - **Step 6:** Provide necessary followup.
