Never Mix Bleach With:

Ammonia Or Acids

Where are ammonia and acids found in the home?

Ammonia may be found in:

- Some glass and window cleaners
- Urine (be careful if you are cleaning diaper pails or cat litter boxes)
- Some interior and exterior paints

Acids are found in:

- Some automatic dishwasher detergents and rinses
- Some lime, calcium and rust removal products
- Certain types of brick and concrete cleaners
- Some glass and window cleaners
- Some toilet bowl cleaners
- Some drain cleaners
- Vinegar

Mixing these products can make deadly gases and can cause burns, cough, watery eyes, and other symptoms.
